Mrs. Mattie Mitchell Is Called By Death

Mrs. Mattie Mitchell, wife of the late Dr. J.B Mitchell of Hancock county, passed away at her home on Broadway at 7 o'clock Thursday morning, Feb. 23rd., after an illness of ten days.

She was born in Arkadelphia, Ark., and on the death of her parents when she was ten years old, came to Knox County, Tenn., and was brought up in the home of an uncle. She was married to Dr. Mitchell more than 30 years ago, and spent the years of her married life in ministering to the sick and suffering. On the death of her husband in 1917 she came to Rogersville, where she spent the remainder of her life.

Here she made many friends and spent a happy, busy life. The "law of kindness" was on her lips, and the faith of the gospel fashioned her conduct. She was a devoted member of the Presbyterian church and few services were ever held in her church without her presence. For a number of years she has been superintendent of the Home Department of the Sunday School and the same faithfulness that marked her whole life was shown in this work which she especially loved.

Her funeral services will be conducted in the Rogersville Presbyterian church on Friday morning at 10 o'clock and the interment will be in the Mitchell cemetery in Hancock county, four miles from Sneedville. She is survived by seven step-children whose love and devotion she won and kept by her kindly heart and unselfish life.
