Died, at Nashville, on Saturday afternoon, 12th inst, David Rutherford, son of Mr John Rutherford, of Knoxville, in the 19th year of his age, at the residence of J G Shepard, Esq. . member of the Baptist church.

Died, at the residence of Major Thomas Brown, near Kingston, on the 10th instant, General John Brown, aged 68 years. . a native of Greene county, North Carolina, and was amongst the first pioneers to what is now Roane county, and at the organization of the county was elected Sheriff, which office he filled for 2 1/2 successive years with credit to himself and satisfaction to the people. He served two campaigns with General Jackson, and distinguished himself as a brave and meritorious officer. He was kind and hospitable in all his relations of life, of much energy, both of body and mind. .

Died, lately, at St Josephs, Missouri, Mr Samuel Breck, son of the Hon Judge Breck, of Richmond, Kentucky. . for several years a resident of Knoxville. .

Died, near Fulton, Arkansas, on the 4th inst, Capt Cooper, of the Tennessee Volunteers.

Died, at his residence near Knoxville, on Tuesday last, Capt John Boyd, aged about 70 years. .
